Dear Mr. Ross,

I am writing to advise you that on December 5, 2017, the Wisconsin Ethics Commission considered your complaint against State Senator Leah Vukmir (2017-ETH-017). After reviewing the materials presented, the Commission made a finding of no reasonable suspicion that a violation of the law occurred as to the allegations. As required by WIS. STAT. § 19.49(2)(b)3. your complaint has been dismissed.

The Commission also made a finding that by a preponderance of the evidence, that this complaint is frivolous in nature. The Commission is not ordering any forfeiture regarding this complaint, but does issue a warning to the complainant, that pursuant to WIS. STAT. § 19.49(2)(b)1m., when a complaint is found to be frivolous the Commission may order the complainant to forfeit the greater of \$500 or the expenses incurred by the Commission in investigating the complaint.
